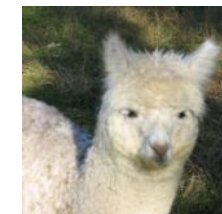

Worshipping with the creatures we love, follows an example of St Francis, who lived about 780 years ago, and is patron saint of animals and the environment.

Many of the stories about St Francis focus on his love for nature and animals. At Christmas he declared: "*Surely the animals praised the new Messiah just as the shepherds and angels did*".
